PARADISE CORNER



"A Fugitive's Capture Brings Relief to a Corner of Pennsylvania." That's the headline from *The New York Times* on September 13, which was right around the time I was planning this installment of "Paradise Corner." The article goes on to summarize the situation that became familiar to all of us. After escaping from a county jail at the end of August, a convicted killer eluded hundreds of law enforcement officers. After nearly two weeks of combing the cornfields and forests of Chester County, with hundreds of law enforcement officers and a battery of drones, dogs and helicopters, the capture itself took about five minutes giving both a headline and a starting point for this article.

I found the story to be an illustration of how far-reaching our fears can be. There are a good sixty (60) miles between Longwood Gardens and here. (This is a botanical garden consisting of over 1,077 acres of gardens, woodlands, where officials believe the escapee spent a lot of time.) Yet, many in our area (including me!) were sometimes nervous. I kept my wits about me more than usual when I was leaving our church home at the end of my time in the office.

Part of our experience of being human is that we become afraid of things that risk making our world different from what we are used to. This is usually because something (like an escapee from prison) has changed reality as we experience it. Changes in reality have caused fear to become prominent in new and unsettling ways. The Covid-19 pandemic was an example of this. While we are in all these challenging situations, we also have resources that can help us not only cope, but also move beyond our fears.

My deeply held belief is that within challenging situations and fears, we have what I like to refer to as "God's Certainty." God's Certainty does not take away the situations that challenge us. To be human is to struggle with realities that cause us to be afraid. What God's Certainty gives us are resources from outside of ourselves that help strengthen the resources we have inside of ourselves. This helps us face the fear of challenging situations.

For example, my very quick and informal (no checking of Hebrew or Greek!) reveals that some variation of the phrase "Don't be afraid" appears 78 times in the Bible. I celebrate such a reminder that—when it comes to struggling with fear—we stand within a long line of faithful ones who not only experienced the challenges of fear just as we do, but also experienced the ways in which God's Certainty brings us through the challenges of those fears.

The fear around the escape of a convicted killer ended on September 13. Life continues. Change continues. Uncertainties continue. God's Certainty helps us face life, change, and uncertainty with God's promising presence for strength and promise.
